



AUTUMN NEWSLETTER 2020



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

We also have staff who have renewed their Paediatric First Aid with Aquarius Training in half term, an interesting approach to the course with covid safe practice - well done everyone!



hand to offer lots of encouragement, praise and opportunities to play inside &




out.




