### LADYBIRDS & BUTTERFLIES





Our little Ladybirds and Butterflies have been keeping cool this month, splashing in the water tray, playing in the shade, exploring the woods, quiet stories under the tree and singing songs. They have been talking about wild animals and looking at books with pictures of tigers, lions, monkeys, zebras and giraffes. The children loved the chunky chalks in the water and making patterns with their fingers. More mark making was going on with fingers making patterns in the paint tray and using paper to capture the colourful effects.



### **DRAGONFLIES**



Dragonflies have been learning about exotic animals this week. The garden room has small world wild animals, masks for the children to wear, mark making areas, playdough station and pictures of animals from around the world. They have enjoyed stories about jingle animals such as 'Georgina the Giraffe' by An Vrombaut and 'Little Monkey' by Marta Altes. The children laughed so much when they pounded, thudded and tiptoed their toy animals through the runny paint and made footprints onto the paper.

The children have had a brilliant time, painting large cubes of ice, splashing in the water tray, rolling balls through the tunnels and tubes, eco-printing using petals on fabric, stories under the tree and singing on the hill.

Following our discussion about pollinators, we were talking about colourful flowers and how they attract insects. We decided to extend this discussion and planned to make some fantastic bunting reusing scraps of material and petals. The children had great fun using the mallet to print the pigment onto the fabric. This required lots of hand eye coordination and spatial awareness. The bunting is beautiful and we know to plant lots of flowers for the pollinators so we only used a few sprigs.



To help keep us cool this month, we have been painting

large blocks of ice. It was fascinating watching the ice melt and disappear during the day. Liz makes the most delicious vegetable curry and rice, served with a naan bread. One little boy told us..."I know what naan bread is made from, it's bananas and naans!"





Our topic this month has been 'Exotic Animals' talking all about the jungle, wetlands and zoo. We have had lots of fun making our own jungle and even made a huge den in the playroom.



We have been making parrots and snakes for our jungle display. Outside we have been using wheel barrows to lift heavy items had a cargo net to crawl under. We have also been playing a memory game by showing the children some items hiding them under a cloth and taking one away then asking them if they remember which item it was. Some of the children had very good memories!
