We've welcomed some children from Ladybirds and we are so proud at how well they have settled.










DRAGONFLIES

KINDERGARTEN - LIFE SKILLS



Every year in May, we run a fortnight programme for Kindergarten children. Although a little different this year with the restrictions on visitors including the emergency services, the children didn't miss out on a fun packed fortnight of bush craft, forest fun, fables & team building games.

For a whole three weeks prior to Life Skills, the team covered the topic 'People Who Help Us' by turning the role play area into a hospital, bandaging their friends, learning what goes in a first aid kit, learning about the dentist, healthy eating and listening to stories and information books.
