

The rough feel of the twigs, the smell of the compost, the smoothness of the grass and the rustling of the foil trips for the river. We certainly had a splashing time!

A Tiger! Who would have thought it! Zoe created another one of her wonderfully inviting Tuff Trays allowing the children to fully immerse themselves in the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' by Judith Kerr. They even had real authentic resources such as china tea cups and baking trays. This gives the children a difference experience other than plastic toys.
