We have been learning about native garden birds. We have particularly enjoyed listening to the different birds both in the garden and using an app on a loud speaker. We have used binoculars to watch and identify our local bird life.

Equipped with clipboards and pens, we have spotted crows, pigeons, blackbirds, robins, herring gulls and wrens.

We were invited to gently hold an old and discarded bird nest. It was fascinating looking at the nest up close. “It got sticks”



FOREST SCHOOL



When children turn three years old, children are presented with a commemorative tree cookie and Forest School birthday card.



This is to mark their third birthday which opens up further opportunity in Forest School to explore and work with elements including ropes, knots, woodwork tools and campfire. It's a rite of passage and marked in a ceremony to celebrate the occasion!



We are working towards our Ruby Robin Award through the 'Songbird Survival' charity.

There are a number of categories to complete and we are currently working on a collaborative project to make bird feeders. We have been using the drill to make small holes in the wood and we have found different size sticks to thread through for the birds to be able to stand on.



Funding

As you know , families may be eligible for Working Extended Funding , from the term after their child is 9 months old – depending on the date parents return from maternity leave.

It is important to apply in good time to gain your funding code, and from then it is really important you renew your account every three months to avoid the code expiring.

Thank you to everyone for returning your funding forms , the transferring of a high percentage of our children to further funded hours has been a big task !

Don't forget to use your Tax Free Childcare if you are eligible as this can be used for any payable fees (up to



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20% of your fees paid by HMRC). Did you know this can be used for babies until they are eligible for funding, and also for children's after school club at their school , and for holiday childcare too. Ask your provider for more details. Donna and Sarah are happy to help with any funding / tax free childcare questions.
