Book aid (https://bookaid.org/) raises money by selling preloved books and for every £2 raised, the charity sends a brand new book. Over 30 different

countries, books are sent to hospitals, libraries, refugee camps and schools.

Danni tells us why she is so passionate about this cause; "I have a sense of pride for the book scheme. This will help more people enjoy books."

Thank you for your recent support whether that was donating books or buying them. We raised £54.15 in cash alone plus our online payments. That's at least 22 new books sent abroad!

We are pleased to be running our Schools Evening this year, with local primary schools all under our roof to meet families who are making choices about their child's education.



Funding

As you know, families may be eligible for Working Extended Funding, from the term after their child is 9 months old – depending on the date parents return from maternity leave.

It is important to apply in good time to gain your funding code, and from then it is really important you renew your account every three months to avoid the code expiring.

Thank you to everyone for returning your funding forms, the transferring of a high

percentage of our children to further funded hours has been a big task!

Don't forget to use your Tax Free Childcare if you are eligible as this an be used for any payable fees (up to

20% of your fees paid by HMRC). Did you know this can be used for babies until they are eligible for funding, and also for children's after school club at their school, and for holiday childcare too.
